Cold Hardy Fruit Trees for the Big Horn Basin:

This is a list of cold hardy fruit varieties that should do well in the Big Horn Basin. Worland is in Zone 4b. Some are on the edge but may be worth trying anyway. You can find your Plant Hardiness Zone here:

There are many good sources of trees, I just chose these based on availability and price. I do not recommend purchasing from a local vendor that does not specialize in plants (i.e. hardware store). There are more options if you want a full-sized tree instead of a dwarf or semi-dwarf tree.

Notes on Pollination:

Apple trees require another variety for full pollination and fruit set. Flowering crab apples can be good pollen donors. Do your research and speak with the nursery staff directly before you purchase. Here are some additional resources:
