MINUTES OF MONTHLY BOARD MEETING

The Washakie County Conservation District (WCCD) held their monthly board meeting on Monday, August 20, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. in Worland at the WCCD office. WCCD Board members in attendance included; Charley Orchard, Dan Rice, Dave Slover, and Susan Pennington. Also, in attendance was WCCD Director Victoria Dietz, NRCS District Conservationist Laura Galloway, and guests representing Chief Washakie FFA; Grace Godfrey, Ivan Perez, Hunter Elliott, and Luke Voss.

Dave called the WCCD board meeting to order at 7:13 p.m.

Charley made a motion to approve the WCCD August 20, 2018 board meeting agenda. Dan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The WCCD Board reviewed the draft July 16, 2018 board meeting minutes. Dan made a motion to approve the July 16, 2018 minutes as read. Charley seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The previously approved WCCD Board Executive Session Minutes of July 16, 2018 were signed by Dan Rice.

The WCCD Board reviewed the draft August 13, 2018 special meeting minutes. Charley made a motion to approve the July 16, 2018 minutes as read. Dan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

NWQI

• NRCS Extends Its Landmark Water Quality Initiatives Through 2023



The Mississippi River Basin Healthy Watersheds Initiative (MRBI) and the National Water Quality Initiative (NWQI) have played a pivotal role in accelerating conservation in water quality by providing targeted funding and technical resources to agricultural producers in the areas that need it most.

These initiatives <u>have been extended</u> to help producers improve water quality in more than 350 watersheds across the country. To date, at least 10 water bodies have been removed or scheduled for removal from the nation's list of impaired streams.

• We do not have enough applications to spend the NWQI funds for Washakie County. It might be a good idea to request they add Horse Gulch watershed and see if we can get that through.

- Astrid came and went on a tour of projects we have been installing in Washakie County on August 10th.
- We had a streambank stabilization team here to tour some potential projects on August 15th.

• The national team will be here the end of August to tour our EWP projects

Tori stated that she was not aware of the opportunity to apply for NWQI and asked Laura for more information, specifically on the deadline. Laura stated that she was waiting on Astrid for further information.

EMPLOYEE REPORTS:

Tori provided the WCCD Board with her July Timesheet and reported on the following: WDA Nowood Watershed Grant Update, reporting that the Board of Ag had approved the grant; Big Horn River Level I Study Update, reporting that she and Karen have had several meetings with Y2 Consultants and that the public scoping meeting was planned for September 25th in Manderson; Women's Ag Expo Agenda/Involvement, reporting that she will giving the welcome on behalf of the Big Horn Basin Conservation Districts and would be having a booth

Melanie Dedic's monthly report was provided to the WCCD Board.

Karen Fenton's monthly report and copy of the Gooseberry Research Results Flyer was provided to the WCCD Board.

Tori reported that Karen has been planning for a Pollinator Workshop at the Outdoor Classroom, which is scheduled for September 8th, and stated that the post cards advertising the workshop have been mailed out.

OLD BUSINESS

WCCD Board Members Up for Re-Election Reminder – Tori reminded the WCCD Board of the deadline for applying for re-election by August 27th.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Chief Washakie FFA - WyRED Report</u> – Grace Godfrey, Chief Washakie FFA Advisor, and three of her students; Ivan Perez, Hunter Elliott, and Luke Voss gave a presentation on their experiences during their recent WyRED activities in Lander. The group thanked the WCCD Board for their continued support.

<u>Big Horn Forest Steering Committee Field Trip</u> – Tori provided the WCCD Board with the agenda and map for the upcoming Big Horn Forest Steering Committee field trip to be held August 28th. Both Dan and Susan stated that they would plan to attend.

<u>Internal Audit</u> – Tori reviewed the Department of Audit Internal Control Evaluation Worksheet with the WCCD Board. Charley made a motion to approve the completed Internal Control Evaluation Worksheet. Susan seconded the motion. Motion carried. The worksheet was signed by Dave Slover and Dan Rice.

<u>Annual Plan Draft Review</u> – The draft WCCD Annual Plan was reviewed by the WCCD Board resulting in the following amendments: Page 15 Waste Management, 1st action in the "completed by" column; change Dan Rice to WCCD Board – Page 18 Government Agency Interaction and Coordination, 4th action in the "completed by" column; change Dan Rice to WCCD Board – Page 23 Internal District Operations, 10th action to remove the apostrophe from in's and from out's. Dan made a motion to

approve the WCCD's Fiscal Year 2019 Annual Plan as amended. Charley seconded the motion. Motion carried. The plan was signed by all WCCD Board members in attendance.

National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD) TA Engineering Grant 2nd Round – Tori presented the WCCD Board with the contract for engineering design work between WCCD and Western Heritage Consulting & Engineering (WHCE), which had been signed by WHCE. Tori stated that the contract includes completion of engineering design work for six NRCS center pivot contracts for \$44,000.00. Charley made a motion to approve the WCCD and WHCE contract for the NACD TA Engineering Design work. Dan seconded the motion. Motion carried. Dave Slover signed the contract.

<u>Paxton Berm Emergency Watershed Protection (EWP)</u> – Tori gave the WCCD Board an overview and update of status of the Paxton Berm EWP project. Tori reminded the WCCD Board that the deadline for proposals from engineering firms for the engineering design work is August 20th, and of the review and ranking meeting set for August 27th at 1:30, for those proposals that are received.

Tori presented the WCCD Board with the landowner agreement between WCCD, Big Horn Cooperative Marketing Association, and Melvin Weinschrott for the Paxton Berm EWP project, which had been signed by Big Horn Co-op and Mr. Weinschrott. The agreement includes information on the 25% match requirement of the two landowners and the plan to utilize the value of the toe rock to fulfil their out-of-pocket cost.

Charley made a motion to approve the WCCD, Big Horn Cooperative Marketing Association, and Melvin Weinschrott landowner agreement for the Paxton Berm. Susan seconded the motion. Motion carried. Dave Slover signed the agreement.

Area III Meeting in Powell – Tori provided the WCCD Board with the 2017 Minutes for the Area III meeting held in Cody and a draft agenda for the upcoming Area III meeting to be held in Powell on September 11th. Tori stated that she would be unable to attend so she could read water samples, but Karen planned to attend. Dan stated that he planned to attend, and Susan and Dave would wait until the time got closer to decide. Susan stated that she was listed in attendance as the Washakie County CD voting delegate in the 2017 minutes and was not in attendance. Tori stated that Dave Slover was the voting delegate that year.

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<u>WCCD Comments on Wyoming Draft RMPA and DEIS for Greater Sage Grouse</u> – Tori provided the WCCD Board with the signed comment letter on Wyoming Draft RMPA and DEIS for Greater Sage Grouse, which was developed by Karen Fenton on behalf of the WCCD Board and signed by Vance Lungren.

Intent To Use Wyoming Department of Ag (WDA) Lab Funds Decision – Tori reviewed the "Intent to Use Lab Funds" form required by the WDA to be completed and signed. Tori stated that she has full intention of using the funds for this last monitoring year for supplies and shipping costs, and also to use the funds for the recently approved WDA grant for a video camera. Dan made a motion to approve the use of the 2019-2020 WDA Lab Funds. Susan seconded the motion. Motion carried. Dave Slover signed the form.

<u>WACD What's Up</u> – Tori provided the WCCD Board with the WACD What's Up email dated July 31, 2018 and the information attached to it; State Fair Support; Final WACD BLM Sage Grouse Comments; and EPA National Rivers Assessment Resolution

<u>City of Worland Sewer Emergency Watershed Protection (EWP)</u> – Tori provided the WCCD Board with a photo of a portion of the City of Worland Sewer EWP project bank, that had sloughed. Tori stated that both Allen Croft and Laura Galloway had indicated that NRCS would probably not fix through the EWP program and that it would probably be the responsibility of the City of Worland to fix, as they did not consider it a failure. Tori reported that she had spoken to Brian Berky, Superintendent of Public Works for the City of Worland, and has requested that NRCS further investigate and provide documentation of why the NRCS would not cover the costs of fixing the bank.
